BCC NEWS & UPDATES

2 July 2020: BCC Quarterly Economic Survey (QES) Q2 2020

On 1 July, BCC published the **results of QES Q2** which found that UK economic conditions deteriorated at an unprecedented rate in the second quarter of 2020. The key findings for this quarter:

- 11 of the 14 key service sector QES indicators fall to their lowest level in the survey's 31-year history.
- The percentage balance of firms reporting increased domestic and export sales is now substantially lower than the worst quarter of the 2008-09 recession.
- Indicators for longer-term business performance drop to record lows as BCC sets out measures needed to begin UK's economic recovery.

2 July 2020: Change in state aid rules for government-backed loans

The EU has extended its state aid temporary framework to all small companies (less than 50 employees and less than EUR 10 million of annual turnover and/or annual balance sheet total), even if they were in "financial difficulty" on 31 December 2019.

This amendment extends possibilities to support more small companies, including those with particular financial structures, such private equity backed firms, or who were in a growth phase and so might have appeared to be in financial difficulty on paper. Take a look at the **details**.

7 July 2020: Travel Corridor Exemption list: 14 day isolation lifted for lower risk countries

From 10 July, passengers returning to or visiting England, from countries or territories detailed in the **travel corridor exemption list**, will no longer need to self-isolate on arrival. All passengers, except those on a small list of exemptions, will still be required to provide contact information on arrival in the UK. 14 July 2020: UK government publishes new Border Operating Model

The **Border Operating Model** provides clarity and certainty for the border industry and businesses, including technical detail on how the border with the EU will work after the transition period and the actions that traders, hauliers, ports and carriers need to take. It covers all of the processes and systems, across all government departments, that will be used at the border. It provides clarity on the end to end journey for moving goods across the border - with information about controlled goods and new government systems that will support trade.

To help businesses prepare for these changes and continue to trade, **guides on how to import and export goods** are available in the form of a 'journey', so that you can clearly see every step you need to take to ensure that your goods are transported successfully.

14 July 2020: BCC responds to further details on the points-based immigration system

See <u>BCC's response</u> to the UK government's <u>publication of further details</u> on the UK points-based immigration system. The new system, introduced from 2021, will require those applying via the skilled worker route to accrue points by meeting a number of relevant criteria, such as having a job offer at the appropriate skill level, the ability to speak English and meeting the salary threshold.

EU citizens resident in the UK by 31 December 2020 can still apply to settle in the UK through the **EU Settlement Scheme** until 30 June 2021.

16 July 2020: BCC submission to Freeports consultation

The UK government wants to establish Freeports, which have different customs rules than the rest of the country, that are innovative hubs, boost global trade, attract inward investment and increase productivity. To support this work, they are running a formal consultation to understand your thoughts on the UK's plans for Freeports.

Following input from across the Chamber Network, the BCC has submitted its **response**.

23 July 2020: BCC Coronavirus Business Impact Tracker: Restart of the UK economy "still in first gear" with businesses operating at just half of normal capacity

23 July 2020: Finance Bill 2020 - 21

A number of key announcements were made in Tuesday's L-Day Written Ministerial Statement. See the below summary:

- Making Tax Digital (MTD) Making Tax Digital (MTD) for VAT to be <u>extended</u> all
 businesses below the VAT threshold from April 2022. MTD will also apply to taxpayers who
 file Income Tax Self-Assessment for businesses and landlords with income over £10,000 from
 April 2023.
- **Business rates revaluation** the next revaluation of non-domestic property in England will take effect on 1 April 2023 and will be based on property values as of 1 April 2021.

• Business rates review call for evidence – following the announcement of a review at the March budget, the government have now published details of the <u>call for evidence</u>
They are seeking responses in two phases – Firstly, views on the multiplier and reliefs, by 18 September, to inform an interim report in the Autumn. Secondly, responses on all other sections by 31 October, ahead of the review's conclusion in Spring 2021. The BCC will be holding a wider CPRG meeting in the coming weeks to shape response to the consultation.
